### NATIONAL ELIGIBILITY CUM ENTRANCE TEST (UG) - 2019 [NEET(UG) -2019]

1.	What is <i>National Eligibility cum Entrance Test-UG [NEET (UG) – 2019]</i> ?	As per regulations framed under the <i>Indian Medical Council Act-1956 and the Dentists Act-1948</i> , as amended from time to time, admissions in 100% seats of MBBS/BDS will be done through <b>NATIONAL ELIGIBILITY CUM ENTRANCE TEST (UG) – 2019 [NEET (UG) – 2019]</b> in Medical/Dental Colleges run with the approval of Medical Council of India/Dental Council of India under the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India except for the institutions established through an Act of Parliament i.e. <b>AIIMS</b> and <b>JIPMER</b> Puducherry.
2.	What is the responsibility of <i>National Testing Agency (NTA)</i> for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	The responsibility of <b>NTA</b> is limited to the conduct of the entrance test, declaration of result and providing <b>All India Rank</b> to the <b>Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India</b> for counselling of <b>15% All India Quota Seats and all seats of Deemed Universities/Central Universities/ESIC &amp; AFMC including Delhi University (DU), BHU &amp; AMU</b> and providing the result to the <b>State Counselling Authorities and Admitting Institutions</b>
3.	When <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> will be conducted?	<b>NEET (UG) - 2019 will be conducted on 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2019 (Sunday)</b> from 02:00 p.m to 05:00 p.m
4.	Whether the examination will be offline or online?	<b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> will be in offline mode (pen and paper test).
5.	What are the duration/timings of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	The duration of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> will be 03 hours from <b>02:00 p.m. to 05:00 p.m.</b> However, no entry will be allowed after 1.30 p.m.
6.	Can a centre be allotted by the <b>NTA</b> manually?	No. Centre allocation is made through computer with no human intervention.
7.	Which are the cities where <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> will be held?	A list of examination centres cities is provided at <b>Appendix-II</b> in the Information Bulletin of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> .
8.	Does <b>NTA</b> reserve its discretion not to fix the centre in a city which is given in the Appendix-II?	Yes.
9.	Can a candidate change its centre city after allotment of roll number?	No. Centre or City cannot be changed under any circumstances. Please be careful while filling in choice of centre.



10.	Can a candidate opt Imphal as centre city if residing in Delhi?	Candidates are advised to select the centre/city in their State of residence or in neighbouring city only.
11.	Can <b>NTA</b> fix the examination centre in any city other than the four options exercised by the candidates?	Yes. <b>NTA</b> reserves its discretion to fix the centre in the city other than the one exercised by the candidate.
12.	From which city foreign nationals, OCIs & PIOs can appear in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	They can choose any <b>four</b> cities as given in Appendix-II.
13.	Who can appear in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	Indian Nationals Non Resident Indians (NRIs) Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) Foreign Nationals
14.	Who can appear in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> for 15% All India Quota seats?	Indian Nationals Non Resident Indians (NRIs) Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) Foreign Nationals are eligible to appear in <b>NEET (UG)-2019</b> for <b>15% All India Quota Seats</b> .
15.	Through <b>NEET (UG)</b> against which seats admissions will be made?	Admissions to all seats of <b>MBBS/BDS</b> will be done through <b>NEET (UG)-2019</b> . Following are the seats, available under different quotas: -  All India Quota Seats State Government Quota Seats Central Institutions/Universities/Deemed Universities State/Management/NRI Quota Seats in Private Medical / Dental Colleges or any Private University Central Pool Quota Seats
16.	Is there any seat in MBBS/BDS on which admission will be made without appearing in <b>NEET (UG) – 2019</b> ?	<b>No</b> . Admissions in 100% MBBS/BDS seats will be done through the <b>NEET (UG)</b> only.
17.	Will admission to <b>AIIMS</b> and <b>JIPMER</b> , Puducherry be made through <b>NEET (UG) – 2019</b> ?	No.
18.	What is the minimum qualification for appearing in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> for candidates of unreserved category?	The Minimum qualification for appearing in NEET (UG) – 2019 is prescribed in Chapter 3: Eligibility and Qualifications of the Information Bulletin. The relevant portion are reproduced below:  CODE : 01 A candidate who is appearing in the qualifying examination, i.e., 12 <sup>th</sup>



		<p>Standard in 2019, whose result is awaited, may apply and take up the said test but he/she shall not be eligible for admission to the MBBS or BDS, if he/she does not pass the qualifying examination with the required pass percentage of marks at the time of first round of Counselling.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>CODE : 02</p> <p>The Higher/Senior Secondary Examination or the Indian School Certificate Examination which is equivalent to 10+2 Higher/Senior Secondary Examination after a period of 12 years study, the last two years of such study comprising of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology (which shall include practical tests in these subjects) and Mathematics or any other elective subject with English at a level not less than the core course for English as prescribed by the National Council of Educational Research and Training after introduction of the 10+2+3 educational structure as recommended by the National Committee on Education.</p> <p><i>Candidates who have passed 10+2 from Open School or as private candidates shall not be eligible to appear for 'National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test'. 19.	What is the minimum qualification for appearing in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> for candidates of reserved category?	In respect of the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes or Other Backward Classes (OBC), the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology taken together in qualifying examination shall be 40% marks instead of 50% marks for Unreserved Candidates.
20.	What is the minimum qualification for appearing in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> for candidates of PwD category?	In respect of Persons with Bench Mark disabilities as per MCI Guidelines/ Regulations in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, the minimum marks in qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology (or Botany & Zoology)/Bio-technology taken together in qualifying examination shall be 45% instead of 50%

21.	What is the minimum qualification for appearing in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> for candidates of Foreign Nationals?	<p>The candidates who have studied from the Foreign/International Board should ensure that the qualifying examination passed by them are, in scope and standard (Last 02 years of 10+2 Study comprising of Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology; which shall include practical test in these subjects) is found to be equivalent to the Intermediate Science Examination of an Indian University/Board, taking Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-technology including practical tests in each of these subjects and English.</p> <p>Provided further that the students' educated abroad seeking admission into medical colleges in India must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology and English up to the 12<sup>th</sup> standard level with 50% marks and their equivalency determined by Association of Indian Universities (<b>AIU</b>) as per regulations of the Medical Council of India and the concerned University.</p>

Which type of Disabilities are included for the benefits of PWD candidates?	<p>5% seats of the annual sanctioned intake shall be filled by candidates falling under Persons with Bench Mark disabilities as per MCI Guidelines/ Regulations in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.</p> <p>Detailed information in this regard is available on the website of Medical Counselling Committee – <b>www.mcc.nic.in</b> and on website of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare – <b>www.mohfw.nic.in</b></p>				



24.	Is a candidate from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana eligible for 15% All India Quota seats?	Yes. The <i>Government of Andhra Pradesh &amp; Telangana</i> vide their letter no.13021/C1/2016 dated 06.11.2017 & letter no.7072/C1/2017 dated 07.11.2017 respectively have informed that <i>Government of Andhra Pradesh and Government of Telangana</i> have decided to join and contribute to the All India Quota seats. Accordingly, the candidates of these States have also become eligible for 15% All India Quota seats (As per letter No. F.No. V.26012/05.2017-MEP/MEC dated 10.01.2018, <i>Directorate General Health Services, Ministry of Health &amp; Family Welfare, Govt. of India</i> )												
25. 26.	If a candidate is opting Oriya as medium of question paper, would he be eligible for 15% All India Quota?	Candidates qualifying NEET would be eligible for All India Quota and other quotas under the State Governments/Institutes, irrespective of the medium in which the examination is taken by a candidate, subject to other eligibility criteria.												
27.	If I am opting Assamese as language of question paper, can I get the centre of examination in Delhi?	No. Allotment of medium of language would be State-specific. If any candidate is opting Regional language as medium of question paper, he will be allotted centre only in respective States of particular Regional language. In the present case, examination centre will be in Assam. However, students opting for Bengali medium are eligible to appear from the State of West Bengal and Tripura.												
28.	Can a candidate of Karnataka opt for Delhi as a centre with Kannada medium?	No. Kannada medium will be available only in the Centres/ cities located in the State of Karnataka.												
29.	If a candidate is opting English as medium of question paper, in which language candidate will be provided Test Booklet?	Candidates opting for English would be provided Test Booklet in English only.												
30.	If a candidate is opting Hindi as medium of question paper, in which language candidate will be provided Test Booklet?	Candidates opting for Hindi would be provided Bilingual Test Booklet i.e. in Hindi and in English. In case of any ambiguity in translation of any of the questions, its English version shall be treated as final.												



31.	If a candidate is opting for <b>regional</b> language as medium of question paper, in which language candidate will be provided Test Booklet?	Candidates opting for regional languages would be provided Bilingual Test Booklet i.e. in selected language and in English. In case of any ambiguity in translation of any of the questions, its English version shall be treated as final.
32.	Can I change the option of language once the form is submitted?	Option once exercised, cannot be changed after submission of application form. As centres will be allotted based on medium of question paper, candidates need to be very careful in choosing the medium of question paper.
33.	Is there any change in the syllabus of NEET, prescribed in NEET (UG) 2018?	No. There is no change in the Syllabus of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> . The Question Papers for the test shall be based on a Common Syllabus notified by the Medical Council of India and implemented in the year 2013 which is at Appendix-I of the Information Bulletin of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> available on the website <a href="http://www.ntaneet.nic.in">www.ntaneet.nic.in</a> and <a href="http://www.nta.ac.in">www.nta.ac.in</a> . It is also available at <a href="http://www.mciindia.org">www.mciindia.org</a> .
34.	What is the syllabus for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	The Question Papers for the test shall be based on a Common Syllabus notified by the Medical Council of India and implemented in the year 2013 which is at Appendix-I of the Information Bulletin of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> available on the website <a href="http://www.ntaneet.nic.in">www.ntaneet.nic.in</a> and <a href="http://www.nta.ac.in">www.nta.ac.in</a> . 35.	What will be the pattern of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	The <b>NEET (UG) – 2019</b> shall consist of one paper containing 180 objective type questions (four options with single correct answer) from Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany & Zoology). This will be a single exam in pen-and-paper mode. The duration of paper would be <b>03 hours</b>
36.	Is there any change in the pattern of <b>NEET (UG)</b> ?	No. The <b>NEET (UG) – 2019</b> shall consist of one paper containing 180 objective type questions (four options with single correct answer) from Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany & Zoology). Is a candidate who has passed class XII with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English subjects from NIOS, eligible to appear for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	<i>Candidates who have passed 10+2 from Open School or as private candidates shall not be eligible to appear for 'National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test'. 39.	If a student has studied up to class 11th from CBSE or any other Board from KSA/abroad and class XII from CBSE in India, will he/she be eligible to appear in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	Yes. The students educated abroad seeking admission into medical colleges in India must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology and English up to the 12 <sup>th</sup> standard level with 50% marks and their equivalency determined by Association of Indian Universities ( <b>AIU</b> ) as per regulations of the Medical Council of India and the concerned University.
40.	Is it compulsory to take Maths if I want to appear in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	Mathematics is not required for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> .
41.	Is a candidate, appearing in Class XII in the year 2019, eligible to appear in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	Yes, A candidate who is appearing in the qualifying examination, i.e., 12 <sup>th</sup> Standard in 2019, whose result is awaited, may apply and take up the said test but he/she shall not be eligible for admission to the MBBS or BDS, if he/she does not pass the qualifying examination with the required pass percentage of marks at the time of first round of Counselling.
42.	If a candidate was born in USA and studied in India and holds OCI Card and wants to apply for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> is he/she is eligible for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	Yes. Indian Nationals, Non Resident Indians ( <b>NRIs</b> ), Overseas Citizen of India ( <b>OCI</b> ), Persons of Indian Origin ( <b>PIO</b> ) & Foreign Nationals are eligible for admission in Medical/Dental Colleges subject to rules and regulations framed by the respective State Governments, Institutions and the Government of India as the case may be.
43.	What is the reservation criteria for seats falling under the jurisdiction of States?	It is as per State Reservation Policy of the concerned State.
44.	What are the reservation criteria for 15% All India Quota seats?	<b>Reservation of seats in Government Medical Colleges under 15% All India Quota:</b>  (i) <b>15% seats</b> are reserved for <b>SC</b> candidates, (ii) <b>7.5% seats</b> are reserved for <b>ST</b> candidates, (iii) <b>27% seats</b> in Central Educational Institutions are reserved for <b>OBC</b> candidates only as per Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admissions) Act, 2006. Reservation would be applicable to the castes mentioned in the Central list of OBC. Thus, the candidates falling in this list may mention OBC in the Category Column in application form. Candidates from creamy layer and those who do not come under Central List of OBC are advised to mention their category as Unreserved ( <b>UR</b> ).
45.	What are the qualifying criteria of <b>NEET (UG)</b> for preparing a merit list?	The candidate must have passed any of the qualifying examinations as enumerated in Chapter 3 of Information Bulletin of NEET (UG) - 2019 or appearing in the qualifying examination in 2019. 46.	How will the <i>National Testing Agency (NTA)</i> declare the result?	<i>National Testing Agency (NTA)</i> will declare the result based on the qualifying criteria provided by Medical/Dental Council of India and All India Rank based on the marks obtained in NEET (UG) - 2019.
47.	What is the meaning of percentile rank?	A percentile rank is the percentage of score that falls below a given score in a group. The Percentile score of a Candidate will be calculated as follows: $\frac{100 \times \text{Number of candidates appeared with raw score EQUAL TO OR LESS than the candidate}}{\text{Total number of the candidates appeared}}$
48.	How will the merit list be prepared by the States?	States will prepare their own merit list based on All India Rank keeping in view the category of candidates.
49.	How will the merit list be prepared for 15% All India Quota seats?	Based on All India Rank and the reservation roster provided by <b>DGHS</b> , merit list for All India quota will be prepared.
50.	When will be the result of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> be declared?	By 5 <sup>th</sup> June, 2019.
51.	How does one know the complete guidelines/instructions for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	The Guidelines for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> are available in the Information Bulletin which is available on the website <a href="http://www.nta.ac.in">www.nta.ac.in</a> and <a href="http://www.ntaneet.nic.in">www.ntaneet.nic.in</a> .
52.	What do you mean by All-India quota seats?	15% seats surrendered by Government Medical/Dental Colleges run as per the approval of <b>MCI/DCI</b> are filled through the counselling conducted by <b>DGHS</b> are known as All India Quota seats. The merit list of the eligible and successful candidates who have opted for 15% All India quota seats will be prepared by the NTA on the basis of marks obtained in the <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> . The list of successful candidates shall be forwarded to <b>the Directorate General of Health Services (Medical Examination Cell), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India</b> for the purpose of allotment of seats by Online Counselling to 15% All India Quota Seats
53.	Will there be negative marking in <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	Yes. Each correct answer will get 04 marks and for each incorrect response, 01 mark will be deducted from the total score.
54.	How long will the result of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> be valid?	The result of successful candidates of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> is valid for the academic session 2019-20 only.

56.	Can anyone cancel the application submitted for <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	Online Application forms once submitted successfully cannot be cancelled/ withdrawn.
57.	What do the candidates need to bring to the exam centre?	Candidates <b>MUST</b> bring only the following documents on the day of examination at the test centre. Candidates who will not bring these will not be allowed to sit in the examination and shall lead to his/her

58.	Can the candidate bring anything other than that mentioned in S.No. 56 above to the examination centre?	Candidates are not allowed to carry any material except the Admit Card, Passport Size photograph and valid Identity proof inside the Examination Hall.
59.	Will any candidate be able to leave early if he finishes the test before the allocated test time?	No candidate will leave his/her seat or the Examination Room/Hall until the Test concludes as per the schedule. Candidates should not leave the Room/Hall without handing over their OMR Sheets to the invigilator on duty.
60.	If one does not get Admit Card, whom should he contact?	Admit cards will not be sent to candidates. These will be uploaded on website by 15.04.2019. Candidates need to download the Admit Card from the website only.
61.	How will one know the result of the <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> ?	The result of <b>NEET (UG) - 2019</b> will be uploaded on the website <a href="http://www.ntaneet.nic.in">www.ntaneet.nic.in</a> as per schedule.
